Notice was posted on the bulletin board in the first floor entrance hall of the School District Administration Building, Gillette, New Jersey. Mrs. Scanlon said there is a NJSBA seminar on salary guides coming up.

#### BOARD COMMITTEE REPORTS

Finance – Mr. Blocker reported the committee reviewed the bills and found all in order for payment. He said Mr. Esposito is working on the budget now and will present information to the committee next week.

Policy – Mr. Carbone commented on the items on the agenda, noting that there are several policies being removed from the Policy Manual as they are covered elsewhere.

Liaison to Watchung Hills High School – Mr. Carbone noted that a former Long Hill Township student won first prize in a New York Times contest. He also talked about an engineering program called Project Lead the Way. The high school has not made a decision yet on moving the annual school election to November.

Community Relations – Mrs. Nyquist wrote an article on the STAR program for submission to the Echoes Sentinel newspaper.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S UPDATE Presentation on Calculating Student Growth Percentiles for NJASK.

Dr. Rovtar's report was a Power Point presentation regarding new models of teacher evaluations going on at the State level. She discussed student performance and how it will be incorporated as part of teacher evaluations. The presentation included a webinar that gave details about the process and how student performance is measured. Dr. Rovtar then explained some of the critical points raised in the webinar presentation. There are multiple models of observation to choose from and money will have to be budgeted for training administrative staff. Due to the sharply increased number of observations required, it will be challenging to the administration to conduct them all.

The Board asked the Superintendent numerous questions and Dr. Rovtar responded to each one in detail. Discussion ensued regarding the potential impact of this dramatic change. Dr. Rovtar noted that many of the details are still being worked out by the State.

#### BOARD SECRETARY'S UPDATE

Mr. Esposito stated that he has been diligently working on the budget. He will be submitting a preliminary budget to the Finance Committee next week. The NJ Department of Education just released the budget software. The Board will need to vote on the tentative budget to be submitted to the Executive County Superintendent on February 27th. The county office will conduct their review and provide us with an approved budget for a public hearing on March 26th. -3-

Mr. Esposito also reported that the debt refinancing is moving forward. On January 25<sup>th</sup> the preliminary official statement will be submitted to Standard and Poors. The final statement will be submitted on February 10<sup>th</sup>. The bonds will be priced and the purchase agreement executed the week of February 20<sup>th</sup>.
