#### Title I Parental Involvement

A school district that receives Title I funds must implement programs, activities and procedures for the involvement of parents in programs supplemented by No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (NCLB) Title I funding. The district will reserve funds to carry out these requirements, which shall include promoting family literacy and parenting skills. Parents of pupils receiving Title I services shall be involved in the decisions regarding how funds will be allotted for parental involvement activities.

## **Policy Involvement**

- 1. Convene an annual meeting, at a convenient time, to which all parents of participating pupils shall be invited and encouraged to attend, to inform parents of their school's participation and requirements of this policy, and the right of the parents to be involved;
- 2. Involve parents, in an organized, ongoing, and timely way, in the planning, review, and improvement of programs, including the planning, review, and improvement of the school parental involvement policy;
- 3. Provide parents of participating pupils:

d. Submit any parent comments on the plan when the school makes the plan available to the Long Hill Township Board of Education, if the program plan under Section 1114(b)(2) of NCLB is not satisfactory to the parents of participating pupils.

### **Shared Responsibilities For High Student Academic Achievement**

Each school serviced by Title I funds shall jointly develop with parents of all pupils serviced with Title I funds, a school-parent compact that outlines how parents, the school staff, and students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement and the means by which the school and parents will build and develop a partnership to help children achieve the State's high standards. The compact will:

- Describe the school's responsibility to provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in
  a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the pupils served by Title I
  funds to meet state standards, and the ways in which each parent will be responsible for
  supporting their child's learning, such as monitoring attendance, homework, and
  television watching; volunteering in their child's classroom; and participating, as
  appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their child and positive use of
  extracurricular time; and
- Address the importance of communication between teachers and parents on an ongoing basis through:
  - Parent-teacher conferences at the elementary level, at least annually, during which the compact shall be discussed as the compact relates to the individual pupil's achievement; and
  - b. Reasonable access to staff, opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and observation of classroom activities.

## **Building Capacity for Involvement**

To ensure effective involvement of parents and to support a partnership among the school involved, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement, each school and school district assisted with Title I funds:

- 1. Shall provide assistance to parents of pupils serviced by the school in understanding such topics as the state standards, state and local assessments, the requirements of this policy, and how to monitor a child's progress and work with educators to improve the achievement of their child;
- 2. Shall provide materials and training to help parents work with their child to improve achievement, such as literacy training and using technology, as appropriate, to foster parental involvement;

- 3. Shall educate teachers, pupil services personnel, building principals, and other staff, with assistance of parents, in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners, and build ties between parents and the school;
- 4. Shall ensure that information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is sent to parents of participating children in a format and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand;
- 5. May train parents to enhance the involvement of other parents;
- 6. May arrange meetings at a variety of times, or conduct in-home conferences with parents who are unable to attend such conferences at school, in order to maximize parental involvement;
- 7. May establish a parent advisory council to provide advice on matters related to Title I parental involvement; and
- 8. May develop appropriate roles for community-based organizations in parent involvement activities.

# Accessibility
