1. RESOLVED that the following minutes of the Long Hill Township Board of Education be accepted as presented and made part of the public record:

2. RESOLVED, that the Long Hill Township School District Board of Education, in the County of Morris, New Jersey approves the 2017-18 school district budget for submission as follows:

General Funds 10, 11, 12	\$15,978,758
Special Revenue Fund 20	\$ 248,471
Debt Service Fund 40	\$ 1,100,638
Total Budget 2017-18	\$17,327,867

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that there should be raised for the General Fund \$14,942,669.00 and for Debt Service \$1,100,638.00 for the ensuing School Year 2017-18; and

The 2.0% cap increase over the prior year, which totals \$292,993.00, results in a maximum district general fund tax levy of \$14,942,669.00.

WHEREAS, The Board has approved that there should be raised for the General Fund a tax levy of \$14,942,669.00 for the ensuing School Year (2017-2018).

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Long Hill Township School District Board of Education, in the County of Morris, New Jersey approves that the unused taxing authority of \$47,746.00 be banked for potential use in the subsequent three fiscal years. The district has a total banked cap of \$285,963.00 for use in 2017-2018.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Long Hill Township School District Board of Education, in the County of Morris, New Jersey approves the following capital projects for the 2017-2018 school year:

Assessment on prior referendum projects (State mandatory deduction): \$33,181

WHEREAS, school district policy and N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.3(a) provides that the board of education shall establish in the annual school budget a maximum expenditure amount that may be allotted for such travel and expense reimbursement for the 2017-2018 school year; and

WHEREAS, maximum expenditure amount allotted for travel and expense reimbursement for the 2016-2017 school year was \$30,000.00; and

WHEREAS, travel and expense reimbursement has reached a total amount \$10,900.00 as of March 1, 2017;

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Long Hill Township School District Board of Education, in the County of Morris, New Jersey hereby establishes the school district travel maximum for the 2017-2018 school year at the sum of \$30,000.00; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the School Business Administrator shall track and record these costs to insure that the maximum amount is not exceeded.

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 6A:23A:5.2 (a) mandates boards to establish annually prior to budget preparation, for public relations and each type of professional service a maximum level of spending for the ensuring school year; and

WHEREAS, the tentative budget includes the following appropriations:

Accounting	\$ 25,000.00
Other Administrative Services	\$ 25,000.00
Repair Services	\$ 306,807.00
Extraordinary Services	\$ 98,400.00
Nonpublic Services	\$ 40,441.00

Transportation	\$ 911,539.00; and

WHEREAS, the Administration needs to notify the board if there arises a need to exceed said maximums, upon which the board may adopt a dollar increase in the maximum amount through formal board action; and

WHEREAS, the Board and Administration wishes to minimize the amount of paperwork involved in this area;

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Long Hill Township School District Board of Education, in the County of Morris, New Jersey establishes maximums for professional services in the areas listed above at a level of 120% of the amounts listed for the 2017-2018 school year.

It is duly noted that this budget represents an increase of **1.99%** in general fund current appropriations and a **2.00%** increase in the general fund tax levy.
