Presentation of the Budget by Mr. Esposito and Dr. Rovtar Questions and answers on the proposed budget Board Member and Public Comment

ADOPTION OF THE 2014-2015 BUDGET

RESOLVED, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent and the Business Administrator, that the Long Hill Township School District Board of Education, in the County of Morris, New Jersey approves the 2014-2015 school district budget as follows:

Total 2014-2015 Budget	\$16,512,595.00
Debt Service Fund	\$ 921,150.00
Special Revenue Fund	\$ 290,107.00
General Fund	\$15,301,338.00

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that there should be raised for the General Fund \$14,206,695.00 and for the Debt Service Fund \$921,150.00 for the ensuing School Year (2014-2015); and

The 2.0% cap increase over the prior year, which totals \$282,113.00, results in a maximum district general fund tax levy of \$14,651,403.00

WHEREAS, the Board has approved that there should be raised for the General Fund a tax levy of \$14,206,695.00 for the ensuing school year (2014-2015).

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Long Hill Township School District Board of Education, in the County of Morris, New Jersey approved that the unused taxing authority of \$416,809.00 be banked for potential use in the subsequent three fiscal years. The district has a total banked cap of \$982,679.00 for use in 2015-2016.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Long Hill Township School District Board of Education, in the County of Morris, New Jersey approved the following capital projects for the 2014-2015 school year:

• Assessment on prior referendum projects (State mandatory deduction): \$33,181.00

WHEREAS, school district policy and N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.3(a) et seq. provides that the board of education shall establish in the annual school budget a maximum expenditure amount that may be allotted for such travel and expense reimbursement for the 2014-2015 school year; and

WHEREAS, maximum expenditure amount allotted for travel and expense reimbursement for the 2013-2014 school year was \$30,000.00; and

WHEREAS, travel and expense reimbursement has reached a total amount \$12,800.00 as of March 1, 2014;

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Long Hill Township School District Board of Education, in the County of Morris, New Jersey hereby establishes the school district travel maximum for the 2014-2015 school year at the sum of \$30,000.00; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the School Business Administrator shall track and record these costs to insure that the maximum amount is not exceeded.

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-5.2 (a) mandates boards to establish annually prior to budget preparation, for public relations and each type of professional service a maximum level of spending for the ensuring school year; and

WHEREAS, the tentative budget includes the following appropriations:

Accounting	\$ 20,000.00
Other Admin Services	\$ 25,000.00
Repair Services	\$280,076.00
Extraordinary Services	\$ 98,400.00
Nonpublic Services	\$ 86,343.00

WHEREAS, the Administration needs to notify the board if there arises a need to exceed said maximums. Upon which the board may adopt a dollar increase in the maximum amount through formal board action; and

WHEREAS, the Board and Administration wishes to minimize the amount of paperwork involved in this area;

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Long Hill Township School District Board of Education establishes maximums for professional services in the areas listed above at a level of 120% of the amounts listed for the 2013-2014 school year.

It is duly noted that this budget represents an increase of 1.26% in general fund current appropriations and a 0.72% increase in the general fund tax levy.

WHEREAS, In February 2011, the Commissioner of Education adopted regulations imposing a cap on the salaries of chief school administrators based on the enrollment of the district in which the administrator serves; and

WHEREAS, The cap on superintendent salaries is unnecessary since the 2 percent property tax levy cap, the statutory limitation on administrative spending growth, regulations adopted pursuant to the School District Accountability Act, and Executive County Superintendent review of employment contracts protect the public's and taxpayers' interests by providing sufficient controls on superintendent compensation; and

WHEREAS, One of the most important responsibilities of a board of education is the hiring of a highly-qualified chief school administrator, who is critical in implementing the educational goals, vision and direction of the community; and

WHEREAS, The salary cap has a negative impact on the quality, stability and continuity of public education in school districts due to high turnover rates, increased use of interim superintendents, and a decline in the experience level of candidates for superintendent positions; and

WHEREAS, For many educators, becoming a superintendent represents the pinnacle of a lifelong ascent up the career ladder, yet the salary cap – which applies to no other positions – has created a disincentive for school leaders to strive toward that goal, which will have long-term negative consequences on educational quality in this State; and

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill No. 2930, co-sponsored by Assemblyman Patrick Diegnan and Assemblywoman Mila Jasey, and Senate Bill No. 1987, sponsored by Senator M. Teresa Ruiz, would prohibit the Department of Education from regulating the maximum salary a school district may pay its superintendent.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Long Hill Township Board of Education supports and urges the passage of Assembly Bill No. 2930 and Senate Bill No. 1987; and be it further

RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution shall be forwarded to each member of the <u>21st</u> legislative district delegation, the Speaker of the General Assembly, the President of the State Senate, the Governor of the State of New Jersey, the Chairs of the Assembly and Senate Education Committees, and the New Jersey School Boards Association.
