Notices were filed with the Township Clerk; and notices were mailed to all persons who have requested individual notice pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act.

COMMUNICATIONS

Mrs. Scanlon received a letter from the County Superintendent of Schools approving Mr. Esposito's contract.

BOARD COMMITTEE REPORTS

Ed. Services Commission – Miss Nyquist attended the annual reorganization meeting and was elected Vice President of the Board.

Finance – Mr. Russo reported that the committee met and reviewed the bills and found all in order for payment.

SPORT – Mr. LoCascio attended the meeting on May 29 where the group discussed the Patriots game fundraiser on June 14. Tickets are available through the Central School office. Leadership positions for next year will be discussed at the next meeting.

Board President's Report – Mrs. Scanlon stated that many board members and community members attended the stained glass unveiling at Central School last week. She indicated that it was a very nice event and expressed thanks to the team that put it together.

STUDENT PRESENTATION

Mr. Villar introduced a group of 7th grade students who made a presentation on an instructional website that they have developed. They explained the development of their online grammar curriculum website and the development of their Emalam group. This project was an outgrowth of an assignment in their language arts class.

SUPERINTENDENT'S UPDATE

Dr. Rovtar congratulated the PTO on their very successful Pennies for Playgrounds fundraiser. A total of \$4,942.57 was raised to help rebuild playgrounds in the New Jersey shore communities that were destroyed by Hurricane Sandy.

Dr. Rovtar presented a PowerPoint presentation on the new teacher evaluation system and the PARCC assessments. The PowerPoint is available on the district website.

She indicated that there is a resolution to approve the submission of the Annual School Self-Assessment for Determining Harassment, Intimidation and Bullying Grades for each of the schools to the New Jersey Department of Education, as required by the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act. These grades were determined by the school safety teams in each building using a rubric provided by the State. The public is welcomed to comment on this during the Public Comment portion of the meeting.

Dr. Rovtar noted that the district will be changing to a new website effective July 1st. A letter will be sent home to parents this week to provide information about accessing the system and how they will need to subscribe to various website pages, such as the Daily Bulletin or Friday Flyers in order to be able to receive email alerts through the website.

Central Middle School

Mr. Villar reported on the following:

WORKSESSION

Technology

Mr. Blinder stated that in order to prepare for the PARCC assessment, a new computer lab is being created at Millington School this summer. The lab will have 29 student computers and 1 teacher station. The computers will be installed this summer. Mr. Blinder participated in the Schoolwires training that Dr. Rovtar offered today. He will be beginning computer placement at Gillette School this summer.

The Board Member discussed the number of computers necessary for the PARCC assessment. Dr. Rovtar indicated that the PARCC guidelines suggest half as many computers as the largest grade to be tested in the school. The 3 labs at Millington and Central will give us the capability to have 2 labs used for testing and still have 1 lab available for instruction while the tests are being administered.

BOARD SECRETARY'S UPDATE

Mr. Esposito reported that he and Dr. Rovtar met with the roof contractor and architect last week regarding the Central School project. The rooftop air conditioning unit above the Central School All Purpose Room will be checked before the roof project begins. This unit has not worked for over a decade. If the unit is not operational, it will be removed from the roof.

A meeting was held with the Temco upper management regarding our expectations for the new contract period which begins July 1. Mr. Esposito stated he has been working with the Board Attorney on finalizing both of these contracts.

The district received the NCLB allocation notice last week. We had been told to expect a decrease in funding, but will be receiving approximately the same amount as this year.

Mr. Esposito stated he has registered all of the Board Members for the fall NJSBA workshop. Board members need to make their own hotel reservation for up to 2 nights if you plan to attend stay in Atlantic City. The district will then reimburse the Board Members.

All Board Members are invited to the LHEA luncheon on Tuesday, June 25th. They will be honoring Mrs. Golub and Mrs. Schwartz who are retiring.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF LONG HILL IN THE COUNTY OF MORRIS NEW JERSEY APPROVING THE USE OF COMPETITIVE CONTRACTING FOR THE SOLICITATION OF BIDS FOR AN ENERGY SERVICES COMPANY AND AUTHORIZING OTHER MATTERS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH.

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Township of Long Hill in the County of Morris, New Jersey (the "Board" when referring to the governing body and the "School District" when referring to the territorial boundaries governed thereby) desires to contract with a vendor to serve as an "energy services company" (an "ESCO") for the installation of energy conservation measures (the "ESIP Project") in an effort to reduce energy costs of the School District; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-4.1(j) and (k), the Board may use competitive contracting in lieu of public bidding for procurement of specialized goods and services, the price of which exceeds the bid threshold, for concessions, and also for the operation, management or administration of other services, with the approval of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs; and

WHEREAS, the Division of Local Government Services in the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs has determined that competitive contracting is an appropriate method of vendor selection for ESCOs; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to use competitive contracting to procure the above mentioned specialized services to implement the ESIP Project;

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-4.3(a), the Board is required to pass a resolution authorizing the use of competitive contracting; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-4.3(b), 4.4 and 4.5, the competitive contracting process, including the preparation of a request for proposal documentation (the "ESIP RFP"), solicitation of proposals, and award of a contract based upon the methodology set forth in the aforesaid ESIP RFP, must be administered by the Board's purchasing agent; and

WHEREAS, in connection with such ESIP Project, the Board is required to submit the ESIP Project to the New Jersey Department of Education and may be required to amend its Long Range Facilities Plan, to the extent required, to incorporate the ESIP Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Township of Long Hill in the County of Morris, New Jersey, as follows:

1. The Board hereby authorizes a competitive contracting process for the solicitation of bids for the ESIP Project, including the distribution of the ESIP RFP in connection therewith. The Board further appoints Parette Somjen Architects LLC, as architect (the "Architect") and Wilentz, Goldman & Spitzer, P.A., as Bond Counsel ("Bond Counsel") and authorizes the Architect and Bond Counsel to prepare such RFP.

2. The Architect is hereby authorized and directed, to the extent not otherwise already accomplished, to submit an application to the New Jersey Department of Education seeking approval of the ESIP Project and to amend the School District's Long Range Facility Plan to include the ESIP Project, to the extent it is not incorporated therein.

3. The President, Vice-President and Business Administrator/Board Secretary or any other appropriate officer or representative of the Board, are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver any and all documents and to do and cause to be done any and all acts and things necessary or proper for carrying out the transaction contemplated by this resolution, and the ESIP RFP. The execution by such officials and officers of any such documents, with changes, insertions or omissions approved by the Business Administrator/Board Secretary, in consultation with the Board's Bond Counsel, shall be conclusive, and no further ratification or other action by the Board shall be required with respect thereto.

4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
