The Long Hill Township Board of Education held a Worksession Meeting on Monday, June 8, 2015 in the Long Hill Township Town Hall. The meeting was called to order by Board President Rita Barone at 7:30 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: Ms. Barone led the Pledge of Allegiance.

ADEQUATE NOTICE OF MEETING:

Adequate notice of this meeting of the Long Hill Township Board of Education was given as required by the Open Public Meetings Act as follows:

Notice was sent to the Courier News, Echoes Sentinel and the Daily Record on January 6, 2015. Notice was posted on the bulletin board in the first floor entrance hall of the School District Administration Building, Gillette, New Jersey. Notices were filed with the Township Clerk; and notices were mailed to all persons who have requested individual notice pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act.

COMMUNICATIONS: Ms. Barone stated that she had received correspondence from Mrs. Christine Blocker suggesting that the Board consider sharing a superintendent with the Warren Township School District.

Dr. Rovtar stated that the Board members had received email correspondence from one parent with regard to the positive experience their child had in Mr. Blanes' class this year.

BOARD COMMITTEE REPORTS

Curriculum— Miss Nyquist reported that the Curriculum Committee met with Dr. Jones this evening to review a number of items. Dr. Jones provided a recap of the programs that had been implemented this year. The committee reviewed the new Algebra I textbook that is being recommended for use beginning in September. The Health and Physical Education curriculum will be reviewed beginning in September. Dr. Jones discussed the proposed new materials for the reading program for grades K-2.

Educational Services Commission of Morris County– Miss Nyquist stated that she had attended the reorganization meeting and will be serving as the Vice President. She is also serving on the negotiations committee.

Policy Committee—Mrs. Moakley indicated that the Policy Committee reviewed the policies on the agenda this evening and recommended some editorial changes to Dr. Rovtar. The policies are recommended for approval on a first reading this evening.

Negotiations Committee— Mr. Stevens stated that the Negotiations Committee had met with the LHEA representatives earlier this evening. He will report to the Board in private session. Additional negotiations sessions have been scheduled for June 11th and June 17th.

Finance Committee—Mr. Carn reported that the Finance Committee reviewed the Financial Reports for April and recommends their approval this evening. The Committee will meet again prior to the Board Retreat to review the year-end financials.

PTO Liaison – Mr. Carn thanked the many parent volunteers for helping with the various student programs that have been happening in the schools. The End of the Year Banquet will be held on June 18th.

FORCE – Mr. DiGiorgio stated that the FORCE Robotics Program will be holding a demonstration and information session on June 12th in the Central Middle School All Purpose Room. The robotics program also did a demonstration at the Millington Downtown Day yesterday which was very well received.

Community Relations Committee – Mr. Carn reminded the public that there will be a public forum to provide input on the qualities and qualifications for the new superintendent on June 15th at 7:30 p.m. in the Central Middle School All Purpose Room.

SUPERINTENDENT'S UPDATE

Dr. Rovtar stated that Governor Christie recently indicated that he was no longer supportive of the Common Core State Standards. The existing standards will remain in place until the NJDOE recommends any changes and those changes are approved by the New Jersey State Board of Education. There have been many activities occurring in the district. Thank you to the tremendous volunteer support that makes many of these events possible. Dr. Rovtar indicated that anyone interested in purchasing the cookbook compiled by the SPORT organization should contact her.

BUSINESS ADMINISTRATOR/BOARD SECRETARY'S UPDATE

Mr. Esposito reported:

- -The contractor for the HVAC project has been doing some preliminary work to prepare for the major work which will commence when school is out.
- -The kickoff meeting for the Cupola Restoration Project was held last week.
- -Teachers have been submitting their School Specialty orders for school supplies for next year.
- -He has received the insurance summary information from the district's broker and will share the information with the Board at a future meeting.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Mr. John Birckhead, Central Middle School music teacher, questioned why he was not included in the resolution on extracurricular appointments for 2015-2016 to be appointed as the baseball coach. Dr. Rovtar said it was an oversight and that appointment could be added to the resolution for Board action this evening.

Mr. Tim O'Hara, a parent of five students in the district, stated that he was asked by a group of parents to present information to the Board of Education. Mr. O'Hara shared a document with the Board members and focused his remarks on his opinion that the Long Hill Township School District is a good one that could be better.

Ms. Barone thanked Mr. O'Hara for sharing his information and stated that the Board would take it under advisement.
