EMPLOYEE SAFETY

Through its overall safety program, the Long Hill Township Board of Education (BOE) shall seek to ensure the safety of employees during working hours.

The Chief School Administrator (CSA) shall be diligent in maintaining safe working conditions for employees. Training shall be provided for employees on occupational containment of bloodborne pathogens. The BOE shall also provide information on possible hazardous substances in the workplace, in accordance with law.

The BOE shall expect employees to follow all established safety rules and regulations, such as those pertaining to the use of safety equipment, the wearing of safety clothing and protective eye devices where appropriate, and the lifting or shifting of heavy weights.

Employees shall report all accidents to their supervisor immediately.
