LONG HILL TOWNSHIP BOARD OF EDUCATION REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING JANUARY 21, 2013

The Long Hill Township Board of Education held a Regular Monthly Meeting on Monday, January 21, 2013 in the Long Hill Township Town Hall. The meeting was called to order by Board President Lisa Scanlon at 7:30 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: Mrs. Scanlon led the Pledge of Allegiance.

ADEQUATE NOTICE OF MEETING:

COMMUNICATIONS: None.

BOARD COMMITTEE REPORTS

Buildings & Grounds – Mr. Meringolo reported the committee met and discussed roof replacements at Central and Millington Schools. The committee recommends going ahead with part of the work this summer. They would try to address other areas at Millington the following year – 2014. The Board asked several questions that Mr. Meringolo addressed.

The committee also discussed other issues such as field work and the purchase of grounds equipment. Mrs. Scanlon asked several questions of the committee and Mr. Meringolo and Dr. Rovtar responded.

WHRHS Liaison – Mr. Stevens attended the Watchung Hills Board of Education Reorganization meeting. Issues discussed there included the Code of Ethics, the timing of appointing Board committees, storm damage, and other topics. He noted that the Long Hill Township Board of Education functions well together.

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Negotiations – Mr. Russo reported the committee will meet with the Administrators next month.

Policy – Ms. Barone reported a technology policy will be on the next agenda with minor revisions.

Finance – Mr. Blocker reported the committee reviewed the bills and found all in order for payment. The budget is still being developed and state aid figures won't be known until the end of February.

SUPERINTENDENT'S UPDATE

Dr. Rovtar reported on the following:

- As the Violence & Vandalism Reports are now required on a half-year cycle, she reported the incidents that occurred between July 1 and December 31, 2012..
- FEMA representatives will be in the district on Wednesday to assess our storm damage.
- Regional Superintendents met today and one of the topics was a White-out Day which would be in support of anti-bullying. Tentative date is March 8.
- Dr. Rovtar also corrected her HIB report from last week.

BOARD SECRETARY'S UPDATE

Mr. Esposito reported on the following:

- Budget development continues to move forward; He met with Finance Committee earlier to review bills and discuss the 2013-14 budget in general terms.
- Mr. Esposito reminded Board Members of the required training sessions. Governance I through IV are all offered in webinars through NJSBA. The Board Office will register Board Members as required by School Boards.
- Financial Disclosure Forms must be filled out on-line starting this year. All Board Members will receive an e-mail from the DOE with log-on information and instructions on how to use the system.

Dr. Rovtar explained that the policy will address the use of these devices, saying they are only allowed in the classroom with the permission of the teacher and should be for instructional purposes only. The policy will indicate that the Board shall not bear any responsibility for damage to or loss of these devices if they are brought to school.
